And a Bill of Directions for the Sherriff's Office of this Province, & for the more easy payment of the publick & County Levys which were both Endorsed Read the first Time & will pass and sent to the House by Col Tilghman

Col Blay and five more brought up the Bill for restraining the ill practices of Sherriffs on executing fieri facias Which was read again & Endorsed will pass

Major Sprigg and Mr Peregrine Frisby brought up the Petition about the publick Library

M^r James Lloyd & Major Sprigg brought up a Bill ascertaining what shall be allowed to Grand & petit Jurors

Capt Scott & Mr Codd brought up the Petition of Samuel Berry of Kent County Carpenter praying a Bill might pass for his naturalization, with the resolve of the House of Delegates thereon that he be added in the Bill already agreed to by this Board whereto they pray the Councill's Concurrence

Which was readily Granted upon his taking the Oaths to the Government and Col Tilghman sent to the House therewith
