We have debated and considered this Remonstrance and find the Country much imposed on on this Account and that the Great House is not employed for the Arms &^{ta} but by private Persons we formerly allowed fifteen Pounds and are now willing to allow twenty Pounds more and desire the Arms &^{ta} may be removed and lodged in the Stadt House And we have resolved That the Public pay no longer Rent for them Houses to which they desire the Concurrence of the Honble President and Council
