June the 29th 1714

Gentlemen-

Upon reading your answer to our message of the 28th June by Col Holland and L¹ Col Young relating to some Statutes of England we have reason to believe you have misconceived our proposal therein. By which we did not offer to you that this General Assembly should Concert what Statutes should be in force here. But that the Question should be Solely Stated to the Lawyers in England to know whither the said Statutes should be in force here or not they being often Asserted as Law & very often denyed Which introduces very great Doubts & Confusion in the Courts of Justice here.

We do agree with your House that the Time of the year p. 915 doth not well admitt you to be long absent from your respective Habitations and therefore shall readily concur with you in the Speedy Conclusion of this Session
