By the House of Delegates
June the 30th 1714

We finding that the Intent of our present of 3^d p Hh^d to your Excellency will in a great measure be eluded the Ships loaden with Tob^o daily departing this Province if the passing the same into a Law should be deferred, Pray your Excellency to appoint us a Time to attend your Excellency with a Bill for Settling a Revenue on her Majesty's present Governour to see your Excellency give the Assent on behalf of her Majesty

Which being read and considered his Excellency the Governour wrote the following Letter to the Speaker of the House of Delegates
