The said Bill being so Endorsed was sent to the House of Delegates by Col Addison Mr Philemon Lloyd Cap<sup>t</sup> Dorsey and Col Tilghman.

Mr Tyler and five more brought up the Bill for Limitation of Officers' Fees, Endorsed
