## By the Council in Assembly June 25th 1714

This Bill read in Council the first and second Time by especial Order and will pass The Words Ready Money being made Sterling Money for that no Advantage redounds to the Freighters in this Province by the Master's Choice to pay the Duty in Currency We being always charged Sterling by the Merchants; nor is your Present now of equal Value with what it was to Colo Seymore Coin not being then advanced

## Saturday 26th June 1714

A Bill for settling a Revenue on her Majesty's present p. 442 Governor read the 3<sup>d</sup> Time with the Amendment proposed the 25<sup>th</sup> Instant by the Council in Assembly, Past for Engrossing.
