We are of Opinion your Message of the 28th Instant by the Hoⁿble Col^o William Holland and Col^o Samuel Young to be a Thing worthy of our Consideration but as we are desirous to put an End to this present Sessions the Time of year being very inconvenient for revising our Laws and that we believe the examining the Statutes of England will require more Time than our urgent Occasions will at present admit us to bestow upon it have referred the same to the Consideration of next Sessions of Assembly to which we pray your Excys and Honours Concurrence

Then the House adjourned till One O'Clock in the Afternoon.
