By the House of Delegates
October the 8th 1714

Your message about the prohibiting the Exportation of Indian Corn this present year being considered, this House acknowledges the same to be of great Importance and tending in all likelihood to the welfare of this province of which your Excellency & Honours always shew your tender regard

We humbly offer the prohibiting the exportation from the tenth day of November till the tenth day of March next, and
