Your Excellency (on the humble Address of this House) of the second of July 1714 praying Directions to be given her Majesty's Receivers to lay their Accounts of the three Pence p Hh^d applied by her Majesty for purchasing Arms and Ammunition for the Defence of this Province) before this House this Sessions, was pleased to return in Answer thereto, that Directions were given the said Receivers accordingly. But the same not being as yet done, we pray your Excys further Directions about the same, and that an Account of the Fines and Forfeitures recēd by the said Receivers be likewise laid before this House this Sessions.
