The Gentl. appointed to agree with M^r Edwards to the Quarter Part of the Lot N^o 37, Report That M^r Edwards offered four Pounds for a fee simple M^r Edwards appeared in the House and agreed to pay four Pounds therefor and to pay the Charge of the Act.

Resolved the Committee of Laws draw a Bill to confirm the same to him.

Ordered M^r Cadwallader Edwards make good and sufficient Window Shutters for all the Windows in the Stadt House where wanting and lay his Accounts thereof before this House, for which he shall be paid by the Public.

Bill relating to poor Debtors read with the Council's Indorsment debated and ordered to be indorsed.
