Att a Chancery Court held at the City of Annapolis the p. 16 Tenth day of October 1717.

His Excellency Orders the Attorney Generall to psecute the said Macnemara for the same, And that a minute hereof be made on this days Proceedings.

M<sup>r</sup> Macnemara one of the Practitioners of this Court having frequently behaved himself in this Court with threatening words and an Indecent and Irreverent Behaviour of which he was Several times Admonished by his Excellency, And still
