J. dinary or repeated, the Court may deprive the offender of his practice in that Court and if such records be made in Severall Courts or he be convict of offences against the Courts and refuse to Submitt or be generally insolent and misbehaving himself to the Courts of Justice and his offences are multiplyed it will be Just and reasonable for the Assembly on hearing p. 23 Such offender or giveing him opportunity of being heard and having Satisfaction of his guilt for the quiet Administration of Justice and the Supporting of the Courts by Act of Assembly to make him uncapable to practice any more in any Court within that Island.
