His Excy having offered to the Consideracon of this House a part of the tenth Article of their Lpps Instruction's to him have herewith sent it you Viz:

Article tenth. Whereas many Laws that were made before the Crown interpos'd in the Government of Maryland Appear to be nulled or at least laid aside by some Subsequent Laws which were made during their Maj^{tys} rule and are yet essentiall to the peace and Quiet of the People of the Province under the protection and Government of a prop^{ty} as well as to his Honour and Safety, Presidents whereof you may find among those made in 1681 and none seems to be more Essentiall than an Act which you are to endeav^t to Pass for Punishment of such as shall Counterfeit our great Seale. Therefore We Desire you'll app^t two of yoth Members to be joyned with one of this Board to inspect into those Laws to note which of them 'tis necessary to renew.
