

Coll^o Tilghman from the Upper house Delivers M^r Speaker L. H. J. the following Message viz.

By the Upper House of Assembly, October the 27th 1720.

On the Petition of Rich^d Thatcher against Mathew Wallace, and hearing the parties on both sides, 'tis Ordered that the said Richard Thatcher be restored to his full Quiet and peaceable possession of in and into the Lands whereof he was Lately dispossesed by the said Matthew Wallace or his Lessee by Virtue of a Writ of possession Issued from the last Prov^l Court and that the Sherr: of Cecil County do make Restitution accordingly And also Ordered That all p^{sons} Concerned in the Dispute of the s^d Lands prepare themselves for a more full and Ample hearing at the next Sessions and that the p^{ties} waite further the Determination thereof.
