Read the Bill Entituled An Act for Uniting part of Baltimore County to Ann Arundell County upon which the following Message was prepared thereto Viz.

By the Upper House of Assembly July the 15th 1726
Gentlemen

We have thought fit to propound to your House before we pass the Bill for adding part of Baltimore to Ann Arundell County that it seems to us very reasonable In order to Inlarge Calvert County now settled by a small Number of Inhabitants that that part of Ann Arundell County which includes the South Side of Lyons Creek branch as far as Abraham Symonds Plantation leaveing his house and Orchard in Ann Arrundell County and running with an Easterly line to the head of Parkers branch and from thence down Parkers branch to Herring Creek Includeing the South Side in Calvert County and the North Side in Ann Arrundell County be added thereto which will greatly ease the Inhabitants of the said County and not lessen Ann Arrundel by a Considerable number so much as the said County will be Increased by the Addition they will receive from Baltimore.
