A Message from the Lower House by M^{rs} Sprigg & Trippe

By the Lower House of Assembly 24 March 1734

May it please your Honours

This House hath appointed Col. Gale M^r Trippe M^r Moale Major Sprigge M^r Hemsley and M^r Tilghman to Join any Member your House shall appoint as a Committee, to enquire into the Accounts and Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Paper Currency.

Read the Petition of the Vestry of Queen Caroline Parish in Ann Arundel County and of M^r Caleb Dorsey and M^r John Dorsey his son Praying that a Bill may be brought in to confirm to the Vestry of the said Parish a title to two Acres of Land entailed by the said Caleb Dorsey on the said John Dorsey and referred to the Consideration of the lower House of Assembly p. 317

Read the Petition of Several Freeholders Inhabitants of Cecil County and other parts of this Province Praying that a bill may be brought in to prevent the woods being set on fire and recommended to the Consideration of the Lower House of Assembly

Read the petition of the Rector Vestrymen and Church Wardens of King & Queen Parish in St Mary's & Charles County praying that a bill may be brought in to levy on the taxable Inhabitants of the said Parish so much Tob^o as will suffice to build them a new Church, and purchase two Acres of Land, and to repair Newport Church and that the new church may be called Christ Church.

Referred to the Consideration of the Lower House of Assembly, recommending that the Sum to be raised be in the paper Currency of this Province.
