You have herewith a Copy of the Assessm^t made & applyed by the Governour and Council towards defraying the charges of this Province for the year 1733, which by an Act of Assembly of this Province is directed to be laid before the General Assembly wherein the Justices of the Provincial Court are by mistake allowed the same for their itinerant charges γ Day, as they have for their Attendance, which we conceive ought to be deducted out of their future Allowance
