A Message from the Lower House by Col Gale & M^r Denton

By the Lower House of Assembly 10th April 1735

May it please your Honours

This House having taken into Consideration the State of the Officers fees in this Province & conceiving it to be of the greatest Importance to have them settled by an Act of Assembly & paid in Current mony hath appointed Col Gale M^r Key M^r Hammond & M^r Denton to prepare a Bill for that purpose & desire your Honour (if you approve of such a bill) will please to appoint some of your House to join them in preparing the same
