Gentlemen

M^r Vachel Denton late Clerk of the Provincial Court having for many years neglected in Violation of the Trust reposed in him the Duty of his Office in not Entering the Judgements of the Court in great number of Civil and Criminal Causes to the apparent Detriment of the Persons concerned therein. And his Excellency in Council by their Advice having ordered the Attorney General to prepare and Exhibit an Information against the said Denton for his said Offence, This House hath thought proper to reject the Bill enabling him to record and Enter up the Proceedings of the Court thinking it unsafe that He should have access to them Who has in so gross a Manner neglected his Duty therein contrary to his Oath and the Trust reposed in him, And recommend to your House the bringing in a Bill to Enable the Secretary of this province for the Time being to Supply the said Denton's Omissions & to compel him to pay the Expence & Charge thereof.
