A Bill from the Lower house by M<sup>rs</sup> Gouldsbrough & Elliott p. 15 Entituled an Act to cut off the Entail of a Tract of Land containing One hundred and thirty Acres lying in Dorchester County being part, of a Tract of Land called Goodridges Choice, and to Entail in Lieu thereof a Tract of Land called the Hope containing fifty Acres also another Tract called the Addition to the Hope containing One hundred and seventeen Acres both lying in the said County of Dorchester thus Endorsed
