L. H. J. It's likewise further Offered by your Committee as an Aggrievance that the Attorney General or Clerk of Indictments should Charge their fees on Execution for Prosecutions in Criminal Cases before the Person Prosecuted be Convicted or Acquitted.

It's also further Offered by your Committee as an Aggrievance that the Sherriffs or Clerks should Charge fees for Summoning or Issueing Summons's in any Causes where the Evidences are ready in Court On the Tryal of Causes to give their Evidences, Unless required by Either Plaintiff or Defendant.

All which foregoing Aggrievances are Recommended by your Committee to the House for their Consideration thereof.
