Whereas Margaret Lloyd the Exequutrix of John Lloyd of S^t Georges hund^d, in the County of S^t Maries, Deceased, exhibited to Philip Caluert Esq^r Judge in Causes Testamentary, the Last Will & Testam^t of the s^d John Lloyd her late husband, the 27th of July instant, Which s^d Will being before him the s^d Philip Caluert, in common forme proued, It is therfore Ordered th^t the s^d Margaret haue Lrēs Admīstaōn drawne Cæcilius Absolute Lord & Prop^e of the prouinces of Maryland and Aualon, Lord Baron of Baltemore &c: To all persons to whom these p^ents shall come, Greeting, Know yee, That uppon the seauen & Twentith of July 1658, Before the cheife Officer for Probate of Wills & graunting Admīstraōns, The Last Will & Testam^t of John Lloyd of S^t Georges hund^d in the County of S^t Maries Gentⁿ Deceased, Was att S^t Maries in common forme proued, W^{ch} Will is to these p^ents annexed, And Admīstraōn of All, & singular the Goods, Chattles & Debts, of the s^d Deceased, w^{ch} any manner of way concerne him, or his s^d Will, was graunted & committed to Margaret Lloyd, Widdow of the s^d John Lloyd, Exequutrix named in the s^d Will, Shee hauing first taken her Oath well & truly to admīster the s^d Goods, Chattles, & Debts, according to the tenor & effect of the same Will, And to make, or cause to bee made a True & p^efect Inuentory of All & singular the goods Chattles, & Debts of the s^d Deceased w^{ch} haue, may, or shall any way whatsoeu^e come to her hands, possesⁿ, or knowledge. And also a True & Just Acc^t, in & concerning her s^d Admīstraōn, when shee shall bee assigned, or lawfully called soe to doe. W^{ch} touching, An Inuentory shee is presently assigned to performe att or before the first of Octob^r next ensuing.
