 neuer making a penny profit thereof, w^{ch} accompt he formerly gaue
 the pff.

The pff further alleageth th^t hee gaue the dēft order to ship it in
 noe ship home, but in his owne ship, & th^t the pff was to runne the
 hazard in the Tob home. But hauing noe wittnes to this contract or
 Bargaine, ffor the clearing of w^{ch} Cap^t Samuel Tilghman sayth
 uppon Oath That hee shipped home Two hogsheads of Tob, w^{ch}
 he receaued of Jenkin Price for the use of Rob^t Kedger & one hogs-
 head of his owne, W^{ch} Three hogsheads hee neuer cleared, or re-
 ceaued a penny for them. But left them for the freight in Cap^t
 Swanleys hands, And th^t the Two hogsheads weighed about Eight
 hund^d pownds, & th^t there remains still due to Robert Kedger about
 Two hund^d pownds of Tob.

It is ordered th^t the dēft eyther returne the Bill of Jenkin Price
 according to his condicōn, or ells pay Two hund^d pownds of Tob wth
 Costs of suite unto the pff.

Came Joseph Edlow & acknowledgeth a Judgm^t to Cap^t Nicholas Whiting v.
 Gwyther Attorney of Cap^t Richard Whyting for seauen hund^d Edlow
 sixty fise pownds of Tob & Cask.

 The humble Petⁿ of Raph Crouch Sheweth That sometime in Crouch v.
 Octob^r last was tweluemonth, M^{rs} ffenwick comming to M^r Thomas Fenwick
 Mathewes howse ēquyred of the s^d M^r Mathews concerning a horse
