

Liber P. C. R. Brandy th^t hee missed, made noe further use of the Boate, nor tooke care to make her fast, whereby the s^d Boate was lost, And the Wind being Contrary, th^t the s^d Sloop could not come home, the s^d Thomas Cornewaleys was forced for securing his Sloop (Shee hauing bad Grown-d-tackle) to desyre Edward Packer to carry her into his Creek where shee still remains. By all w^{ch} yo^e Pet^e is damnified att the least, One thowsand pownds of Tob. for w^{ch} he desyres the s^d Dauid fferreira may make him satisfaction & hee shall pray &c :

The Dēft sayth, that he hyred the pffs Boate, to the intent as is alleaged in the pffs Petⁿ, But altering his mind & intention, & resoluting to stay there where hee was, & putt of his goods, hee made noe use neyther of the Sloop or small Boate, And th^t all his goods were landed wth that Boate w^{ch} belonged to the Catch, & brought his s^d goods in, neyther did hee claime any interest in the Boate, or tooke any charge of her.

Edward Nanfan sworne in open Court Sayth, That John Mickay tooke a small Boate belonging to Cap^t Cornewaleys Sloop, & rowed after some fowle in S^t Georges Riuer w^{ch} were Shott. And Dauid fferreira calling to him bad him come on shoare. Mackay answered him saying the Boate is none of yo^{es} & fferreira replyed againe saying That it was, for hee had hyred it, And Mickay to this Depon^{ts} thinking did not row six strakes after but came immediately on shoare wth the Boate.

The Deposⁿ of Robert Sallowes aged 30 yeares or thereabouts Sworne & Examined the 7th day of January 1658

This Depon^t Sayth th^t betweene one & two of the Clock about the ninth of nouemb^r last, Both the Sloop & Small boate was deliuered unto Cap^t Cornewaleys seruant, for the use of Dauid fferreira, And the s^d Seruant complayning unto this Depon^t th^t hee wanted a Roape to fasten the small Boate, this Depon^t gaue him one small Roape to fasten the same, & this Depon^t further sayth, th^t hee wth some others brought a boates loading of goods in the Vessells Boate about 4 or 5 a clock the same day & layde att the sterne of the other Boate. And th^t whillst Dauid fferreira was disputing about a Cask of Brandy wth the Seamen John Mickay & an Indian tooke the Boate to fetch some fowle, w^{ch} they had shott in the Riuer, & th^t Dauid fferreira called to them to bring the Boate a shoare, telling them th^t hee had hyred the Sloop & Boate. Whereuppon the s^d Mickay & the Indian brought the Boate a shoare, & doth uerily beleieue th^t Dauid fferreira was there, yett he deposeth th^t Dauid fferreira was att the same Landing after the Boate came ashoare & further sayth not

Jurat Cora me Josias ffeudall.

M^r Edward Packer sayth uppon oath, That att the request of Cap^t Cornewalleys hee carried the Sloop into the Creek. But the small Boate was lost the night afore.
