And the s^d Cap^t ffuller did giue this Depon^t some medicines, & aduised her how to giue them to her, & how to make use of them to dresse her soares. And the s^d seru^t would bee allwayes Crying uppon Owens, That Rogue Owens had undone her. And th^t hee had gyuen th^t disease unto her, after the s^d wicks had bought her. And th^t the s^d Owens did make use of her body, after a uery inhumane manner, & keepe her downe uppon her face, th^t shee could noe wayes help her selfe. And further this Depon^t sayth th^t being aboard of Cap^t Leech's shipp wth M^r Wicks & M^r Carline, And M^r Owens being att the same p^ent aboard the s^d ship, The s^d Wicks demanded of the s^d Owens, what his reason was to beate & abuse the mayd after hee had bought her of the s^d Owens? & the s^d Owens answered shee had a peremptory tounge.
