The humble Petⁿ of Thomas Cornwaleys Sheweth, That where- as Will^m Stephenson did surreptitiously gett into his possesⁿ a large fowling peece of yo^r Pet^{rs}, W^{ch} being demanded by yo^r Pet^r of the s^d Stephenson, or th^t he must enter an accõn agst him for it, being then in p^eson att the first Pou: Court, held for this prouince by this p^ent Gou^r. The s^d Stephenson desyred yo^r Pet^r to forbear &, promised satisfaction therefore to yo^r Pet^r. But he neuer came before his death, since w^{ch} yo^r Pet^r hath demanded satisfaction of the Widow, & of Henry Ellery now husband to the Widow, But both refuse, Wherefore yo^r Pet^r humbly prayeth the s^d Ellery may bee Ordered to returne the s^d gunne p^efectly fixed, or satisfaction therefore, & hee shall pray &c :

To the Petⁿ of the p^{tf}, The Dēft sayth That Cap^t Waring & other soldiers, who came from Seauerne deliuered this Gun, now in dispute to M^r Stephenson his predecesso^r, & att his earnest request: It being taken by them from out Cap^t Stones howse.

Patrick fforrest aged 30 yeares or thereabouts sworne & examined this 9th of Aprill 1659 Sayth, That in Aprill Año 1655, being att Cap^t Stones howse, (there being M^r Durand, Cap^t Waring, Cap^t Smith, Cap^t Wicks & seuerall others newly arryued from Seauerne) he this Depon^t heard M^r Stephenson make a great complaynt for a gun; Saying hee was a stranger, & newly come into the Country, & th^t it would bee a greate preiudice to him if they tooke his gun away, & hee complayned likewise th^t hee could not find his owne gun, or words to th^t effect, & hee this Depon^t sayth, th^t he heard those aboue mentioned, to bid him goe into the Hall, & make choyce of a gun, & further sayth not.

Cap^t Sampson Waring informeth the Court th^t M^r Stephenson had a gun deliuered him from out Cap^t Stones howse, but whither it was his owne gun or not, hee cannot remember.

It appearing to the Court th^t the s^d Stephenson hid first his owne gun, & then came, & entreated for a gun; & soe had another gun deliuered him (as the dēft himselfe acknowledgeth, & th^t he brought
