Whereas James Veitch p^{ff} hath petitioned this Court agst John Day, Alleaging how the s^d Day being arrested att the suite of Will^m Chaplin, & refusing to putt in security to answeere the s^d suite the p^{ff} was obliged by uertue of his Sheriffs Office to secure the dēfts person for one hund^d & seauen dayes, for w^{ch} he demands 2140^l Tob of the dēft. The dēft sayth th^t he refused not to putt in Bayle: for hauing occasion to goe ouer the Riuer about his affayres he profered him M^r Tho. Thomas to be his Bayle; & th^t he remayned wth the p^{ff} about Ten dayes before he profered him this security, during w^{ch} time the p^{ff} tended on him not aboue three dayes att the most, & further th^t the p^{ff} permitted & allowed him to goe & stay att his owne howse, (w^{ch} the p^{ff} himselfe acknowledgeth hee did) Veitch v.

The Judgm^t of the whole Board is, th^t the dēft pay unto the p^{ff} (for those three dayes hee tended on him, as his prisoner) sixty pounnds of Tob & noe more, & allso pay Costs of suite.
