And the finall Concord betweene the s^d parties is, That the s^d parcell of Land as afores^d, wth all the dwelling howses, Tob howses & other Edifices whatsoeu^r, gardens, orchards scituate & being in Resurrection Manno^r in Caluert County afores^d be conueyed to him the s^d Thomas Belcher, & the same to enioy, to him, his heyres, & assignes for eu^r.

Whereas att a Court held 6^o Octob^r last 1658, It was Ordered th^t the Land belonging to Cap^t Will^m Lewis, in Nangemy Creek be extended soe far forth as it will goe to pay the Cred^{rs}, And th^t all the Cred^{rs} bringing in their claymes, bee the Apprayso^{rs} of the s^d Land soe to bee extended, And whereas the Cred^{rs} att this Court haue petitioned th^t the s^d Land bee forthwth extended & apprayed, & th^t M^r Prescottt haue the refusall of the s^d Land, after the s^d Extent be layd thereon.

Wee the Jury being all Agreed, & according to a writt of Partition from the hon^{bte} Josias ffendall Esq^r Gou^r &c: dat 2^o Martij 1658, Doe Returne o^r Verdict as followeth, (Viz) Wee doe allot unto D^r Luke Barber Esq^r That parcell of cleared Grownd, wth the appurtenances Lying next his now dwelling howse from a marked Dead Oake, standing a little below ffoxes Poynt, Sowth East into the woods, commonly called the Deuiding Lyne of Ranolph Reuell & James Johnson in a right Lyne to a small Gumme Tree.

Wee doe also allot unto the Heyre of Henry ffoxe all th^t parcell of cleared Grownd wth the appurtenances beginning att the forementioned Dead Oake a little below ffoxe's Poynt, soe running downe the Bay to the mouth of the Spring-Branch: from thence to the s^d Spring, w^{ch} wee equally deuide betweene them the s^d Docto^r, & the Heyre, ffrom thence to the head of the Spring Branch Sowth East & by East, to a marked Cedar standing neare the path to Poplar-Hill in the s^d Lyne of Randolph Reuell & James Johnson.

And wee also doe allot to Docto^r Barber one parcell of Woodland Grownd, beginning att the Mouth of the Spring Branch running downe the Bay to a marked Oake standing on the Bay side, ffrom
