

tooke up, & sold the same, Crauing therefore th^t the s^d Thomas Miles may eyther according to his Engagem^t wth the p^f giue him Assurance that he may peaceably enioy the same wthout molestaõn or trouble, or ells repay the 510^l Tob back againe to him. It appearing by the dēft his Condiçõn or Bill of Sale shewen in Court th^t Nicholas Wyatt first tooke up this Land, & sold the same to the dēft And the dēft sold the same againe to John ffreeman p^f, And for that the s^d Nicholas Wyatt hath not subscribed the Engagem^t, as is provided for by Act of Assembly, nor made Oath of ffidelity to his L^p according to Condiçõns of Plantaõn proposed by his L^p & still refusing soe to doe, hath consequently made himselfe incapable of gyuing any assurance of the Land soe sold by him; or of holding any other Land of or from his s^d Lordship, according to the Condiçõns of Plantaõn.

It is therefore Ordered That the s^d Nicholas Wyatt who first sold this Ten Acres, (hauing noe right thereto, in not complying wth the Condiçõns of Plantaõn as afores^d) Repay back that ffue hundred & Ten pownds of Tob to John ffreeman: And ffreeman againe to pay the same summe to his L^{ps} Receiuer, for the L^d Proprietaries use, And thereuppon the s^d ffreeman to haue that Land confirmed unto him, & his heyres for euer from his s^d Lordship, wth Charges of Court.

Thomas Ringhould informes the Court, how th^t M^r Joseph Wicks being appoynted Deputy Surueyo^r, hath surueyed a parcell of Land knowne by the name of the Lower Easterne neck, where Thomas Hinson is now seated, in behalfe of himselfe & the sayd Hinson for 300 Acres or thereabouts: whenas there is much more Land wthin those marked Bownds soe surueyed by him. Defrawding thereby his L^p of the Land, & consequently of his due Rent. And therefore Craues th^t the Court would authorize some One, to Resuruey the same Land againe.

Ordered (according to the s^d Ringhoulds Request) That M^r Robert Burle, Resuruey that same parcell of Land, formerly surueyed as afores^d, & Returne Certificate of the Suruey thereof to the next Prouinciall Court to be holden 4th of Octob^r next.

Commisⁿ to M^r Rob^t Burle &c: according to the Order.

Whereas M^r Thomas Hinson hath petitioned the Court, Shewing That hauing warr^t to take up Land, The Surueyo^r being not then able to Lay out the same, Authorized him to marke any parcell of Land not formerly marked or surueyed, & att his next comming up into these parts he would suruey the same for him, W^{ch} the Pet^r did, Yett the Surueyo^r not hauing layd out the same & deputing M^r Will^m Coursey his Deputy, his Brother M^r [Henry Coursey] intends as the Pet^r is informed to obstruct him in th^t his choyce, Presuming that his s^d Brother, being Deputy Surueyo^r, eyther hath or will suruey th^t
