To w^{ch} Petⁿ of the p^{tf}, the dēft (by his Attorney Cap^t Sampson Waring) denyeth what is alleaged in the s^d Petⁿ, as first, th^t he wrongeth the s^d Orphan, secondly th^t hee is of noe kinne to the s^d Orphan.

Whereas John Par the Orphan of Rob^t Par Deceased was putt into the possesⁿ & tuition of the dēft by Order of Court. And it appearing by the testimony of diuers Neighbours now actually present in Court, that the dēft treateth the Orphan louingly & well. It is therefore Ordered th^t the dēft reteine, & keepe still the sayd Orphan, and his Estate.

The p^{tf} not making appeare what hee alleageth agst the dēft in his Petⁿ, The Dēfts Attorney Craueth an nonsuite agst the p^{tf}, W^{ch} was graunted him by the Court, wth Costs of Suite.

The humble Petⁿ of Daniel Clocker Sheweth, That whereas the Jury (in the Case depending betweene yo^r Pet^r, & M^r Symon Ouerzee the Attorney of M^r Job Chandler) hath fownd yo^r Pet^r yett unsatisfyed. Yo^r Pet^r demandeth satisfaction to the ualew of fife hund^d pownds of Tob & Cask, ffor yo^r Pet^{rs} Wifes Attendance, being in the busiest time of her Dayry. And one hund^d pownds of Tob for the Coffin, according to the usuall rate of the Prouince wth Costs of suite And yo^r Pet^r as in duty bownd shall pray.
