Will^m Ireland aged 25 yeares or thereabouts sworne & Examined Eod. die Sayth, That hee did know there was loue betweene Henry Mitchell & Grace Molden, That he this Depon^t did speake to the s^d Grace of it, But shee denied it, That Henry Mitchell acquainted him wth it, & told him th^t hee heard the Seruants of the howse were agst it. And this Depon^t desyred the s^d Henry to tell him, w^{ch} Seruants those were: But the s^d Henry refused to tell him, & further sayth not.

Jurat Cora^m Sampson Waring.

Was called afore the Board Grace the now Wife of Henry Mitchel & Examined. And the s^d Grace confidently declared, th^t Henry Mitchel did not Steale her away (as the Court is informed) But rather more willingly shee went away wth him; then hee did wth her: for that shee was before th^t time resolved to marry him, bearing loue & affection to him, And it not appearing by any of the Depos^{ns} shewen in Court, that the Dēft did steale away his now Wife (Grace Molden) And the p^{tf} not able to make further prooffe thereof, The Dēft craues an nonsuite w^{ch} was graunted him.
