The Judgm^t of the whole Board is th^t the Adm̄istratrix repay back the Tob allready receaued, and allso the forementioned Bills, or the Tob specified therein. And soe Ordered accordingly.

Brooke v. Utye Whereas ffrancis Brooke hath petitioned this Court in behalfe of his Brother Thomas Brooke, Shewing th^t both hee & his s^d Brother came into this Prouince fowre yeares since, being both bownd by Indenture to serue M^r Hen: Corbin fowre yeares apeice, And whereas the s^d M^r Corbin sold both him & his Brother to Coth Nath: Vtye, wth whom they lyued one whole yeare, And then the s^d Coth sold them both againe to M^r Joseph Wicks for ffowre yeares to exspyre being a yeare apeice more then they couenanted for wth their first Master, Soe th^t hauing serued the s^d M^r Wicks three yeares, they both demanded their ffreedome. In the interim (they being att the neighbo^{rs} howses) M^r Wicks goeing to the Coth, & certifying him, how th^t both those seruants, hee bought of him for the time afores^d, claymed their ffreedome. The s^d Coth directing his war^t to the Constable forced the Pet^{rs} Brother Thomas Brooke to returne againe to his fores^d Master, M^r Joseph Wicks, & there to remaine & serue him Two yeares longer, then the s^d Thomas first couenanted for (whereuppon hee conceiueth. . . .) And wth all setting the Pet^r ffrancis Brookes free.

p. 349 It is Ordered th^t this Cause be respited till next Prouinciall Court And th^t Coth Nath: Vtye, by th^t time produce the Seruants Indenture, or proue by other sufficient Testimony th^t the s^d Thomas hath soe long time to serue, as hee sold him for, & now claymeth, (W^{ch} hee assumeth to doe) And it is further Ordered th^t the s^d Thomas Brooke in the meane time, remaine wth his fores^d master, & performe his labour: Who is to bee allowed & satisfied for his s^d labour & seruice; in case hee shall then bee adiudged ffree by the Board.
