The humble Pet<sup>n</sup> of Augustine Herrman Sheweth That yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> layd an Attatchm<sup>t</sup> uppon the Estate of Maior John Billingsley att the Cliffts for the sume & ualew of fiue thowsand pownds of good merch<sup>bte</sup> Tob & cask, due unto yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> by specialty euer since p<sup>o</sup> Septemb<sup>r</sup> 1657, And whereas the s<sup>d</sup> Maior John Billingsley hath Ordered M<sup>r</sup> Tho: Manning by a speciall assignm<sup>t</sup> for the satisfaction of yo<sup>r</sup> humble Pet<sup>r</sup>. Hee therefore craues an Order of Court, th<sup>t</sup> paym<sup>t</sup> forthw<sup>th</sup> may bee made him, & hee noe longer delayed, w<sup>th</sup> Court Charges & forbearance. And he shall pray &c:

Vppon the fores<sup>d</sup> Pet<sup>n</sup> of Augustine Herman agst the Estate of Maio<sup>r</sup> John Billingsley, The s<sup>d</sup> Billingsley being since deceased, & the Tob attatched like to bee lost, for th<sup>t</sup> noe one yett hath taken out lr<sup>es</sup> of Adm̄istraõn, & uppon delay in danger to be spoyled: There being fiue hogsheads of Tob Returned by the sheriffe Attatched on that writt, The Attatchm<sup>t</sup> being in nature of an arrest, And the s<sup>d</sup> Billingsley confessing and writing to M<sup>r</sup> Tho: Manning, how th<sup>t</sup> hee is indebted to the s<sup>d</sup> Augustine, & willing him to come to agreem<sup>t</sup> w<sup>th</sup> him, & pay him such Tob, as was due w<sup>ch</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Billingsley acknowledged to bee about three thowsand pownds of Tob, (as the s<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Manning deliuered in Court)

The Judgm<sup>t</sup> of the Court is, And soe Ordered, That the s<sup>d</sup> Augustine Herman take those ffieue hogsheads of Tob allready attatched by the sheriffe, Hee gyuing in security to bee accomptable to the Adm̄istrato<sup>r</sup> of the s<sup>d</sup> Billingsley Estate, when euer hee shall bee called thereto; & Returne the same, if in Case, it proue not due to him the s<sup>d</sup> Augustine

Augustine Herman demands Attatchm<sup>t</sup> agst the Estate of Maio<sup>r</sup> John Billingsley for 3000<sup>t</sup> Tob, There being due to him as he alleageth 2537.

Writt to the Sheriffe of Caluert County to Attatch &c: Ret next Prouinciall Court to be holden.

The p<sup>tf</sup> sheweth to the Board, That hee made an agreem<sup>t</sup> w<sup>th</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Harrise, the dēfts Wifes former husband, to serue & supply the s<sup>d</sup> Harrise, & his family w<sup>th</sup> physick, & other medicines touching his practice from March till August following, hee paying him therefore one Thowsand pownds of Tob, And auerreth uppon Oath in Court, th<sup>t</sup> hee neuer yett receiued any satisfaction therefore, & thereuppon brings in his accompt for physick &c: amounting to sixteene hund<sup>d</sup> & thirty pownds of Tob.
