C. That hee did heare John Waghop say, That hee had gyuen the Seamen that Tob, they were carrying away; & tht looking uppon some of the sd Tob, hee sayth thi it was sownd & of a James Veitch. good coulor, & further sayth not.

Robert Cornish deposed in open Court sayth That the hogshead of Tob now in dispute was damnifyed; Lying in the Tobacco howse one whole summer uppon the grownd, wth one head out, & part of the Tob. out allso.

George Mackall Jurat idem quod Robt Cornish Suprà, This suite is dismissed, & Ordered That each pay their owne Charge, in Consideraon of their neglect.

The Court adiorned by the Gouernor till to morrow morning att o a Clock.

This Day came Will^m Battin & acknowledgeth Judgm^t for One March 2 Rock v. Battin Thowsand nine hund & ffifty pownds of Tob & Cask to bee payd att Pickyawaxent on the last day of October next to Mr Joseph Rock, or his Attorney. And is in satisfaction of a Judgmt or Order of Court yesterday had & obteyned agst him the sd Battin by the sd Rock for Vid. fol. 354 flueteene pownds, seauen shillings & nine pence sterl. as is conteyned in the sd Order aforesd.

Came Capt Miles Cooke & assigneth ouer unto Philip Caluert Esqr Cooke v Attwicks That Judgmt yesterday had, agst Humphrey Attwicks for One Thow-Vid. fol. 356
