These p<sup>e</sup>nts wittnesseth th<sup>t</sup> I Thomas Cole, being arrested att the suite of Tho: Manning in an acc<sup>o</sup>n of the Case att a Prouinciall Court houlden att Maryland att the howse of Thomas Gerard, Know yee th<sup>t</sup> I the s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Cole doe hereby appoynt my trusty & wel-beloued ffriend Will<sup>m</sup> ffuller to answere the s<sup>d</sup> suite & to pleade my cause. And whatsoever my s<sup>d</sup> Attorney shall doe therein, I doe by these p<sup>e</sup>nts ratify, allow, & confirme. Wittnes my hand this 14<sup>th</sup> of ffebruary 1659.

The pff Sheweth ouer & aboue then what is mentioned in his Pet<sup>n</sup>, That This ffowre hund<sup>d</sup> ffowrty ffowre pownds of Tob. hath bene due to him from Rob<sup>t</sup> Simkin euer since An<sup>o</sup> 1652 according to the s<sup>d</sup> Simkins Bill. p. 364

Cap<sup>t</sup> Sampson Waring Sworne in Court Sayth That the d<sup>e</sup>ft possessed himselfe of the s<sup>d</sup> Simkins Estate, & of one hund<sup>d</sup> Acres of Land belonging to him.

The d<sup>e</sup>ft by his Attorney acknowledgeth Judgm<sup>t</sup> for the fores<sup>d</sup> summe of Tob, Prouided the pff be content to pay himselfe out of a parcell of Land Lying in Patowmeck Riuer, & belonging unto him, To w<sup>ch</sup> the pff doth agree. And it is further agreed & consented unto That the s<sup>d</sup> Land bee sold by an inch of Candle. And the surplusage ouer & aboue his Debt, (when sold) the pff to deliuer to the d<sup>e</sup>ft.

To the hon<sup>bte</sup> the Gouverno<sup>r</sup> & Councell &c:

The humble Pet<sup>n</sup> of Gregory Murrell most humbly Sheweth That one M<sup>r</sup> Nicholas Morris of Verginia, about Two yeares since did arrest yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> in an acc<sup>o</sup>n of Debt, & the teno<sup>r</sup> of the writt running w<sup>th</sup> out bayle or mainprize yo<sup>r</sup> poore Pet<sup>r</sup> was enforced to lye in prison 102 dayes before the day of tryall. And when yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> appeared, not any p<sup>e</sup>son appeared for the pff. Whereby yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> obteyned a nonsuite w<sup>th</sup> Costs, Now since w<sup>ch</sup> time the s<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Nicholas Morris hath arrested yo<sup>r</sup> poore Pet<sup>r</sup> againe. And hath employed M<sup>r</sup> Symon Ouerzee to bee his Attorney; who hath undertaken the same, Murrell v.  
Overzee's  
Estate
