The def^t answeres that he did Signe such a Bill and other bills to Daniell Johnson but itt was vnjustly gotten at dice, The Wittnesses swears th^t the bill was given in Consideracōn of the delivery of another Bill given by Robert Henley to Daniell Johnson for five thousand five hundred pounds of tobacco

Ordered that the def^t doe pay vnto the p^lt 5500th Tobacco and Costs of Suite

Stanley v.
Burdett

Hugh Stanley in humble manner Complayneth That in February 1660 Thomas Burdett Confessed Judgem^t to Thomas Trueman for a heifer and Calfe, the milke of th^t Heifer with Costs of Suite

The same Co^{rt} he arrested yo^r Orato^r but discontinued his suite ag^t October Co^{rt} following, he againe arrested yo^r Orator & obteyned order to pay him a Heifer and Calfe, with such dammage as he had payed the said Trueman. Yo^r Orator further sheweth that after the s^d order the said Burdett came vnto him and demanded 3000th of tobacco in lieu of that order but yo^r Orator disputing his demand offered him satisfaccōn according to the Contents of his s^d order, and sent one James Jolly along with him to pay him who went together as both yo^r Orator and the s^d Jolly Conceived satisfaccōn, Tobacco due to the s^d Burdett more then the ordinary costs
