J. serving as a Member and that therefore, out of a due Regard to the Rights and Priviledges of the House as well as in Compliance with the Laws of the Country and more particularly to preserve that Independence so absolutely necessary in this Branch of the Legislature Have Resolved, that he be dismissed from his Attendance as a member, and accordingly by their Order he was to understand that he was dismissed
