Session Gannon, John West, William Clements, junior, Samuel Peck, Laws Edmund Melton, Francis Tate, George Russell, William Willoughby James, Robert Walmsley, Solomon Trener, and Garret Corbert, by their humble Petition to this present General Assembly, have set forth, that they have continued Prisoners for Debt in the Custody of the Sheriffs of the several Counties aforesaid, and still continue in the like deplorable Circumstances, and not being able to redeem their Bodies with all the Estate or Interest that they have in the World, which they would readily deliver up and part with to their several and respective Creditors, if they would accept the same and Grant the said Petitioners their Liberty, which seems so unlikely for them to obtain, that unless relieved by a particular Act Passed in their Favours, which by their said Petition they have humbly prayed, they must inevitably continue Prisoners for Life. And for that the Truth of the said Petitioner's Allegations are made appear to this present General Assembly by sufficient Testimony, and that the said Petitioners are fit Objects of Charity, and that their lying in Goal can be no Benefit to their Creditors, it is humbly Prayed that the said Petitioners may be Relieved according to their Prayers, and that it may be Enacted. And be it Enacted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary,

by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and

the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the p. 36 same, That unless all or any of the Creditor or Creditors of any of the said Prisoners, or the Attorney of such Creditors aforesaid within this Province, shall, within Twenty Days after the End of this Ses-Creditors to sion of Assembly, go to the Sheriffs of the aforesaid Counties of go to the Anne-Arundel, Prince George's, Calvert, Talbot, Charles, Queen-Sheriffs in 20 Days, Anne's, Somerset, St. Mary's, and Cacil, and give good Security to and give pay the Imprisonment Fees the Sum of Ten Pounds of Tobacco per security for

Fees, &c. Day, that shall or may become due from the said Prisoners respectively, after the end of the said Twenty Days, and also find the said Prisoners, sufficient Meat, Drink and Cloathing, during their future Imprisonment; and in case they the said Prisoners shall deliver up and surrender, or cause to be delivered up and surrendered, to the Sheriffs of the Counties aforesaid, in the Presence of Two Justices of the Peace of the said Counties, whom the said Sheriffs are hereby required to Summon, on the request of the said Prisoners, at some convenient Time after the receipt of this Act, not exceeding Ten Days, all their Real and Personal Estate, either in Possession, Reversion, Remainder, or in Trust, or in or unto which they have any Claim or Interest whatsoever, and likewise before the Day before mentioned, convey, assign, transfer, and make over, unto the Sheriffs of Anne-Arundel, Prince George's, Calvert, Talbot, Charles, Queen-Anne's Somerset, St. Mary's, and Cæcil, Counties, for the use of the said Creditors, all such their Estate, Interest or Claim as aforesaid. after such manner as by the said Sheriffs, and by the major Part of
