 Newton of the 2^d Regim^t 1 p^r Overalls each to be charged to the
 Continent.

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt. Joseph Smith of
 Col^o Nath^l Gists Regim^t four hundred Dollars the Gratuity allowed
 by a Resolution of the Gen^l Assembly of the 4th of Dec^r 1778 and the
 further sum of Two thousand Dollars by the Act relating to the Offi-
 cers and Soldiers &c^a passed July 1779 agreeably to a Resolve of the
