That the said Treasurer pay to Edward Owings four Pounds, two shillings & six Pence of the new Emission in lieu of seventy five Pounds & ninety Pounds due him p Acc^t passed by the Dep^y Aud.

That the said Treasurer pay to Jonathan Parker an Express engaged agreeable to the Resolution of Congress one hundred and fifty Dollars on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Gilbert Middleton Five Pounds, five shillings & four pence half penny of the new Emission in lieu of ninety Pounds fifteen shillings due him p Acc^t passed by the Dep. Aud^r

That the said Treasurer deliver to Charles Williamson Esq^r 7 hhds. of Tobacco to be delivered over to Thomas Jones Contractor for Horses in Calvert County on Account.

That the said Treasurer deliver to James Calhoun Esq^r Commissary for Baltimore County 100 hhds of Tobacco on Account.

That the Issuing Commissary deliver to Capt. Gilbert Middleton of the Plater 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ Gall^s of Rum the allowance to the Hands of said Boat.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Capt Gilbert Middleton 2 ls Marline and also 2 Shirts, 1 Upper & 1 under Jacket, 2 p^r Stockings 1 p^r Shoes and 1 p^r Breeches for Negro Michael belonging to the State

That M^r John Shaw Armourer deliver to Capt. Gilbert Middleton of the Plater 15 ls Cannon & 5 ls Musket Powder, 3 ls Match rope. 10 ls Musket Ball, 1 Powder horn & Pricker, 1 Quire Cartridge Paper 50 Gun flints & 6 p^r Handcuffs.
