

Liber C C have no Authority to dispense with the Law, or suspend the Operation of it, in any other Manner than that we have mentioned. We hope the Enumeration of these Facts, and the Reasons and Observations suggested by us will be deemed satisfactory and induce your Excellency to think with us, that nothing incompatible with the combined Interest of France and America has been done or intended to be done by the General Assembly or the Executive of this State, No Inconvenience hath, as yet, arisen from the Law; the Navigation of the Bay and Rivers having been, ever since, obstructed by the Ice, and will, most probably continue so far some Time, in the mean Time we most ardently desire to have the Pleasure to inform your Excellency, we have received such Assurances as will enable us to comply with your Request.

That the said Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut James Jn<sup>o</sup> Skinner of the 7 Regim<sup>t</sup> 3 yds Linen for Lining and 2 pair of Stockings in part of the Articles allowed &c<sup>a</sup>

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Allen Quynn Esquire two hundred and twenty five Pounds, six hundred and ten Pounds, and also the further sum of six hundred and seventy five Pounds, seven shillings and six Pence due him p<sup>r</sup> acc<sup>ts</sup> passed.

That the said Treasurer pay to Uriah Forrest three thousand six hundred and seventy five Pounds due him as Aud. Gen<sup>l</sup> to the 31 Dec<sup>r</sup> inclusive.

That Capt. George Keeports deliver to Lieut James John Skinner of the 7 Regim<sup>t</sup> 1 $\frac{3}{4}$  yds. blue Cloth 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  yds mixed D<sup>o</sup> and 3 yds shalloon in part of the Articles allowed by the General Assembly.
