Your Committee find by Inspection into the Books of the Loan Office, and on the best Examination they were able to make, that the following several Sheriffs are deficient to the Publick on Account of the two following Acts, viz.

An Act for issuing and paying out of the Office of the Commissioners or Trustees for emitting Bills of Credit established by Act of Assembly, the sum of £2562..10 Current money, in Bills of Credit, to be applied for the Encouragement of Persons voluntarily inlisting themselves in his Majesty's Service; and an Act entituled An Act for raising and issuing money, for maintaining his Majesty's Forces to be raised in this Province, and for Transporting them to the Place of Rendezvous in the West Indies; as by the Account hereunto annexed appears, viz.
