Col. Hammond from the Upper House delivers M^r Speaker the

Daniel Dulany and Richard Lee Esquires from the Upper House,
 Acquaint M^r Speaker and the Members of this House, that the Gov-
 ernor requires their immediate Attendance in the Upper House, to
 see the foresaid Bill passed into a Law M^r Speaker, with the mem-
 bers went to the Upper House, where his Excellency passed the said
 Bill into a Law by sealing it with the Right Honourable the Lord
 Proprietary his great Seal at Arms, and Endorsing it thus. "on
 Behalf of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of this Prov-
 ince I will this be a Law"
