Gentlemen In Answer to Your Message by Doctor Carrol and Doctor Buchanan for the Concurrence of this house to the application of Ten Pounds Currency to Purchase Paper and Ink for the Publick Use We acquaint you, that the Governor whose Concurrence is Necessary for the application of Publick Money is not in Town Yet as the application of the sum mentioned in Your Message is but small and seems to be necessary to the Dispatch of the Publick Business.
