Session Laws Petition, further set forth, that the said Parish is so large, and lies so inconvenient, that a vast many of the Inhabitants thereof cannot possibly come to the Parish Church when Erected as aforesaid, and therefore pray that a further Sum of Fifty Pounds Current Money, may be also raised and levied as aforesaid, and applied towards Building a Chapel already begun, standing between Monoccasy and Seneca Creek; and that the like Sum of Fifty Pounds may be also raised, levied and applied, towards erecting one other Chapel at some Place between Anti-eatum and Connogocheague; and that the said Two Chapels may be adopted Chapels of Ease in said Parish for Ever: All which being by this present General Assembly, thought reasonable; It is humbly prayed that it may be Enacted,
