Captain Thos. Addison. A gentleman residing upon his Estate in Maryland. Raised his Company at his own Expence, was wounded upon the Attack of Fort Lazare, and Major Gen'l Wentworth gave him a good Character.

Captain John Lloyd. Lived in Maryland upon his own Fortune, where he raised his Company at his own expence, was upon Service during the whole Expedition. Major General Wentworth and Brig'r Gen'l Blakeney gave him a good Character.

Captain John Milburn. Lived at Maryland upon his Estate, raised his Company at his own Expence, was on Duty in the Expedition till the Regiment was reduced, and Major General Wentworth gave him a good Character, his Commission's dated the 9th June 1740.
