I Hereby Certify that last february I seized Five hundred and Six bushels of wheat from Col^o William Henry whoe Purchased the said Wheat on Account of M^r William Smith of Baltimore Town for the French Marine, that I Ground the said Wheat which Produced Seventy eight Barrels neat Weight One hundred & fifty four hundred one Quarter and Twenty three pounds and that the said flour was last March delivered to Col^o Hollingsworth at the head of Elk for the American Army.
