We shall be obliged to you, to order on Duty such a Number of the Militia as Colo Rawlings may call on you for, for the Purposes above mentioned. An Order of the 21st October last was drawn by this Board on the Collector of the Tax for Washington County in favor of Colo Moses Rawlings for Twenty five thousand Pounds, is this Day returned.

On the Application of His Excellency the Chevalier de la Luzerne to this Board, Mr Beyerfalk Lieut. in the Regiment of Deux Pont, in the service of his Most Christian Majesty, is hereby Permitted to enlist into that Regiment any Deserters from the German Troops in the Service of Great Britain which are within this State.
