Honourable Sir Yours of the 12th Instant is just come to hand and am sorry to inform you, that notwithstanding the Time is expired in which the Collectors should have paid into the Treasury both the five and ten pound Tax, that only one has fully paid up, and that the Collector of this County, Worster, Talbot, Kent & Cecil have only paid the £5 Tax. Queen Anns has paid the five & part of the Ten pound Tax, Dorset & Somerset has not paid one Shilling and indeed I suppose it will be a Considerable time before they doe as I understand the Collectors never entered on the Collection untill Last week, those that have paid has been in Grain Certificates & I dont expect to receive anything else from those that has not yet paid except from Dorset & Somerset where there is very few Certificates.

The Sum in my hand not being to the Amount of £10,000 I should not have thought of sending a Special Messenger with it but meeting with this oppertunity by M^r William Robinson who is goeing on business for M^r Potter to you. I have sent you all the money in hand as Treasurer which Amounts to the following Sum N^o 1. 2 & 3 Amounting to £3602: 1: 3 and also one bundle N^o 4 amounting to £3234: 5: 0 Currency & one Gold Johannes for £6: which was
