Ordered That M<sup>r</sup> John Shaw immediately repair the Carriages belonging to the small Cannon or field pieces at this place, and where they cannot be repaired to be serviceable that new ones be made

It appears to this Board from Information given that Andrew M<sup>c</sup>Curty of St. Mary's County and Clark Pilot and resident of said County and David Hunter Pilot and resident of Calvert County have been seen with the Enemy, and this and the Neighbouring State being at this time invaded by Privateers and Cruisers of the Enemy, We deem the going at Large of the said Andrew M<sup>c</sup>Curty Clark and David Hunter to be dangerous to the safety of this State. We do therefore hereby authorize require and Command the Lieutenants of the said Counties to arrest the said Andrew M<sup>c</sup>Curty Clark and David Hunter and them send immediately before us under a sufficient Guard.

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt Alexander Trueman Eight Pounds eight shillings and nine pence of the new Emission in lieu of three hundred and thirty seven Pounds ten shillings and five Pounds three shillings and one penny half penny of the same Emission in lieu of Two hundred and six pounds, five shillings due him per Account passed by the Aud. Gen<sup>l</sup>

That the said Treasurer pay to John Bullen Esq<sup>r</sup> Fifty Pounds Specie for a Horse purchased of him by the Governor and Council for M<sup>r</sup> Green to go to Philadelphia for the plates for the Emission of money.
